

I therefore declare to you the entire forgiveness of all your sins, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **C: Amen.**

The presiding minister and the assembly greet each other in the peace of the risen Christ.



<sup>11</sup> Every priest stands day after day at his service, offering again and again the same sacrifices that can never take away sins.

<sup>12</sup> But when Christ had offered for all time a single sacrifice for sins, "he sat down at the right hand of God," <sup>13</sup> and since then has been waiting "until his enemies would be made a footstool for his feet." <sup>14</sup> For by a single offering he has perfected for all time those who are sanctified.

<sup>15</sup> And the Holy Spirit also testifies to us, for after saying,

<sup>16</sup> "This is the covenant that I will make with them

after those days, says the Lord: I will put my laws in their hearts, and I will write them on their minds,"

- <sup>17</sup> he also adds,
- "I will remember their sins and their lawless deeds no more."
- <sup>18</sup> Where there is forgiveness of these, there is no longer any offering for sin.

<sup>19</sup> Therefore, my friends, since we have confidence to enter the sanctuary by the blood of Jesus, <sup>20</sup> by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain (that is, through his flesh), <sup>21</sup> and since we have a great priest over the house of God,

<sup>22</sup> let us approach with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. <sup>23</sup> Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful.

<sup>24</sup> And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, <sup>25</sup> not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

<sup>5</sup> Then Jesus began to say to them, "Beware that no one leads you astray. <sup>6</sup> Many will come in my name and say, 'I am he!' and they will lead many astray. <sup>7</sup> When you hear of wars and rumors of wars, do not be alarmed; this must take place, but the end is still







# **Apostles' Creed**

Baptized in the name of our Triune God we profess boldly what we believe:

P/A: Through the years you have gathered your church and this community for worship, fellowship, formation, and service. Enable us to look beyond the walls of our building to perceive where you are calling us forward. Merciful God,

**C:** receive our prayer.

- P/A: With thanksgiving we remember saints and angels who delight in your everlasting presence. As their lives inspire ours, provoke us always to love, holding fast to the confession of our hope in you. Merciful God,
- **C:** receive our prayer.

- P: We offer our prayers to you, graciousGod, trusting in your boundless lovefor all that you have made, throughJesus Christ our Savior.


Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying:


### **The Communion**

After receiving the Sacrament return to your pew by way of the side aisles.








